**July 04 September 04**

Tuition fees for the month of July & August have already been given. Tuition fees for the month of September will be given in the month of October 2004 to 91 tutors.

- ☞ Money for text books have been given to 795 girls among them 21 students have been given full payment of their expenditure of books.

3 training programmes have been conducted during this period for the members of core team.

3 meetings were organized in which tutors, school teachers were present. In these meetings improvement of the grades obtained by the students was discussed. And also problems of admission of the girl students in high schools also highlighted.

For the purchase of books a grant of Rs.125/- per student is given but this amount is too low. To purchase all books it required about Rs.500 to Rs.1000/-So the guardian will have to bear the lion share of this expenditure. But some of the guardians express their inability to bear such a huge amount.

- ❖ 10 schools visit have been conducted.
- ❖ Magazine distributed to 752 girls.
- ❖ 60 tutors have been provided 60 black boards, chalk, duster.
- ❖ 91 tutors have been provided , map, question banks etc.
- ❖ 3 globes have been purchased for 3 centers.
- ❖ Some of them have been provided art papers, crayon etc. to prepare interesting teaching materials.
- ❖ 91 tutors have been provided magazines and story books for their students.
- ❖ The teachers are distributing story books to the students and also keep records in the register supplied to them.
- ❖ The students after completing their respective story books, exchange the same with those of their friends.
- ❖ NISHTHA has also collected some old story books and magazines which are also distributed among the tutors, who on their turn, distributed the same amongst the students.
- ❖ A list of story books has been prepared for purchase.
- ❖ The teachers have also prepared a list of reference books, life sketches, travelogues etc. and requested NISHTHA to purchase the same for the facility of their teaching course. Authority of NISHTHA has agreed to consider that the purchase of these books if fund is available.
- ❖ The competition among the students to write ghost stories, detective stories, adventure and comic and also discussion on any issue by the students was very successfully helped. Teachers, students and the assembled guest were very much enthusiastic about this competition. Both teachers and students participated in this competition very actively. Some of the students could write stories or could speak on certain issues very well. Everybody present was very much happy with this competition and praised the organizer for organizing such new ideas. They also requested to hold such competitions and many other new ideas periodically. Some the girl students could draw beautiful sketched based on comic stories, which were highly appreciated by all. Most of the students could read or write comic and other stories for the first time in their life. The day- long program ended with big applause from public.

Observing the high enthusiasm and also accepting request from different corners the organizer agreed to arrange another such competition in near future.

- ❖ The tutors are continuing with the new programme of weekend classes with the more backward students. Under this programme one tutor was taking a class in one Sunday a month. Those students who are not at home in some subjects are reaping much benefit out of this new programme. It is expected that this programme will yield good result in future.
- ❖ A new fund of \$500 was allotted to NISHTHA to meet the expenditure on the excursion trips of the students to different places of interest in Kolkata in the month of October 2004.
- ❖ The pen pal programme which started earlier part of this year is successfully continuing. The students here are very much enthusiastic of this programme and their guardians are very happy on the point that their children could write letters to their foreign counter parts under this programme.
- ❖ The substitutes of 37 drop out students have been admitted in the girls' education programme.
