For the period: October 05-December 05

☞ 64 tutors were given tuition fees for the months of October and November and also tuition fees for the month of December 05 would be distributed in the month of January 2006.

☞ 3 tutor meets were conducted

Issue discussed :

1. Tutors Training and new methods.
2. Problems of teaching.
3. Monthly grade sheet.

☞ **Experts visit**

Mrs. Rithu Sarawgi visited NISHTHA for 6 days during this period. Out of these 6 visits, she covered coaching classes for 3 days. She also conducted a discussion with social workers of this programme for the whole day to give them clear idea about new teaching methods and strategies to solve the problems of girls education programme. She also conducted tutors training for two days.

☞ **Tutors Training**

Mrs. Rithu Sarawgi conducted 2-days training for tutors of girls' education programme.

Issue discussed :

1. How to effectively use the new teaching materials purchased from market.
2. Idea of preparation of innovative teaching materials.
3. Different problems faced by tutors.
4. Findings of Mrs. Sarawgi during her visits of coaching classes.

☞ **School visit**

Our social workers visited government high school for 15 times during this period.

Headmasters and some of the assistant teachers helped NISHTHA very much.

☞ Our social workers undertook regular home visit of houses of 1000 girls.

☞ Monthly tests had been taken in October, November and December and grade sheets of those months had already been sent to you.

☞ **Guardians and tutors meet:**

12 guardian meetings with tutors had been conducted during this period. Tutors had discussed the problems which they had to face due to irregular attendance of girls in the coaching classes. They also discussed about the grade sheet in those meetings. Parents gave important suggestions.

☞ **Important incident**

1. Parents of Chumki Manna (Sl. No. 149) arranged her marriage. But six days before the marriage the news was spread out and other students of girls education programme with the help of social workers of NISHTHA, launched protest against this marriage and compelled the parents to stop the marriage. Now Chumki is attending her school regularly.
2. Parents of Kajal Dhali (Sl. No. 471) and Rukia Khatun (Sl. No. 161) decided not to allow their daughters to continue their studies. NISHTHA social workers intervened with the help of Panchayat members and the parents now have allowed their daughters to go to school.
3. Two drop out girls(Kandan Sardar and Anjali Naskar) were re-admitted in the high school. They dropped in March 2005 from girls education programme. We tried to convince their parents to send them to school for a long time. Now they are regular students of Matangini Hazra Balika Vidyalaya.
4. We noticed a change of attitude among the tutors. Most of them were trying to adopt the methods taught by Mrs. Sarawgi and they were taking more interest to prepare teaching materials.

☞ During this period 3 leadership trainings were conducted by the core team. Average attendance per training was 55 heads.

☞ **School Uniform**

Uniforms had been distributed to 434 girl students.

☞ **Mrs. Usha Ramaswami** started to conduct weekly special coaching camp on English from 12.12.2005 with 50 students at Umarpota and Tongtola villages.
